BALL STATE FOOTBALL QUICK HITS

⇒ Ball State finished the regular season with a 10-2 overall record and 7-1 in the Mid-American Conference . . . The Cardinals have won 16 of their past 18 regular season contests . . . Ball State is 12-1 in its last 13 MAC contests.

⇒ Ball State has posted 10 victories in 2013, which marks only the third time in the school's 89 year football history the Cardinals have won at least 10 games in a season . . . The Cardinals were 10-1 overall in 1978 . . . Ball State was 12-2 overall in 2008.

⇒ Ball State's seven MAC wins marks only the fifth time since joining the league in 1975 the Cardinals have tallied at least seven wins in the MAC . . . The Cardinals were 8-0 in 1978 and 2008, 7-0-1 in 1993 and 7-1 in 1996.

⇒ Ball State finished second in the MAC's West Division, which is the best finish for the program since winning the West in 2008.

⇒ Ball State has reached bowl eligibility for a third straight season . . . The last time the Cardinals won at least six games in three straight seasons came when the team reached the mark in four straight campaigns from 1988-91 . . . Ball State won six games in 2011, nine games in 2012 and 10 in 2013 . . . This marks the second time the Cardinals have played in back-to-back bowl games . . . Ball State played in the 2007 International Bowl and the 2008 GMAC Bowl plus played in the 2012 Beef 'O' Brady's St. Petersburg Bowl and now the GoDaddy Bowl.

⇒ The Cardinals have scored 481 points this season, which ranks as the second highest single-season total in school history . . . The school standard for points in a year is 489 in 2008.

⇒ Ball State reached the 40-point mark for the seventh time this season when it won its regular season finale 55-14 over Miami University, setting the school record for the most games of 40 or more points in school history . . . The Cardinals scored 50 or more points three times in 2013, which is a Ball State school record.

⇒ Ball State ranks No. 1 in the Mid-American Conference and ninth in the country in passing offense (333.3) plus is No. 2 in the MAC and 13th in the nation in scoring offense (40.1) . . . The Cardinals rank No. 7 in the nation in turnovers gained (30), ninth nationally in turnover margin (+1.0) and fourth in the MAC in scoring defense (24.8) . . . Ball State leads the country with 18 fumble recoveries . . . The Cardinals lead the MAC and are eighth in the nation for fewest penalties per game (3.83) and are No. 7 in the NCAA in fewest penalty yards per game (31.58).

WENNING WAYS

- Keith Wenning holds the Ball State career records for touchdown passes (91), passing yards (11,187), pass completions (1,012) and pass attempts (1,598).
- Career MAC Rankings: touchdown passes (4th), passing yards (6th), pass completions (4th) and pass attempts (4th).
- Keith Wenning is the ONLY Football Bowl Subdivision quarterback in the country with at least 299 passing yards in 10 games this year.
- Wenning ranks fifth in the nation with 3,933 passing yards, sixth with 327.8 passing yards per game, 27th in the country with 13.29 passing yards per completion and 10th with 331.5 total offense yards per game.

THE LEMBO LEGACY

- One of 20 coaches in the country named to the Paul "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year Award Watch List.
- Reached his 100th career coaching victory with Ball State's win over Kent State.
- Owns a .676 winning percentage (25-12) through 37 games as Ball State's head coach, which marks the best winning percentage in a coaching career for the Cardinals since 1967. The winning percentage ranks as the second best among Ball State's 13 head coaches since 1924.
- One of 7 current Football Bowl Subdivision head coaches to have posted 9 or more wins in a season at 3 different schools -- Pete Lembo, Ball State alum Brady Hoke, Dennis Franchione, Paul Johnson, Brian Kelly, Urban Meyer and Nick Saban.
- Selected as one of five coaches you need to know in USA Today.
- Guided the Cardinals to a 4-3 record over teams from Football Bowl Subdivision Automatic Qualifying Conferences in his three seasons at Ball State with wins over Virginia, South Florida and Indiana (twice).
- One of only six Mid-American Conference head coaches since the advent of the Bowl Championship Series to have won four or more games against teams from automatic qualifying conferences.

Ball State News and Notes

Captains: Nathan Ollie, Connor Ryan and Keith Wenning are serving as captains for the 2013 season.

Ball State Graduates: Three members of the Ball State football team -- Zane Fakes, Joseph Fazio and Connor Ryan -- have each received their bachelor's degrees already from Ball State.

Touchdown Machine: **Jahwan Edwards**, who ranks 20th in the nation in rushing touchdowns, set the Ball State record for total touchdowns in a career with 38 . . . He scored the 38th TD of his career in the second quarter at Northern Illinois . . . Edwards has scored all 38 of his TDs on the ground and also holds the school record for rushing touchdowns in a career . . . He has had three 100-yard rushing games this season and 11 in his career . . . His 11 100-yard rushing games in a career is tied for fourth on Ball State's all-time list.

Wenning Ways: **Keith Wenning** holds the Ball State career records for touchdown passes (91), passing yards (11,187), pass completions (1,012) and pass attempts (1,598) . . . He is second in school history, behind only Ball State assistant coach Joey Lynch, in pass completion percentage in a career with a .633 mark . . . Lynch owns the school standard with a .638 mark.

Wenning Ways Part II: **Keith Wenning** has thrown for at least 300 yards in a game a school record 16 times in his career, 400 or more yards a school standard three times in his career and 250 or more yards in a game a school record 22 times in his career . . . His 3,933 passing yards through the regular season is the Cardinals' single-season record, while his 3,095 in 2012 ranks fourth and his 2,786 in 2011 ranks fifth.

Wenning's Contributions: **Wenning**, who set the school record with six touchdown passes in the regular season finale vs. Miami University, has accounted for 39 touchdowns this season with 34 TD passes and five rushing scores . . . He ran for his fifth touchdown of the year and the 13th of his career at Northern Illinois . . . Wenning has thrown five TD passes in a game twice in his career -- at Akron in 2013 and vs. Kent State in 2012 -- to become one of only two players in Ball State history to throw five touchdown passes in a game twice in a career . . . Wenning has thrown at least two touchdown passes in 15 of his past 17 games and he has thrown at least three TD passes in five of the last six games . . . Wenning's 34 TD passes in 2013 set the Ball State single-season record.

Willie Snead IV: **Willie Snead**, who ranks fourth in the nation with 14 receiving touchdowns, broke the school record for TD catches in a season with his two vs. Central Michigan . . . He ranks second on Ball State's career list for receiving TDs with 25, while the all-time leader is Darius Hill (2005-08) with 31 . . . Snead has 10 touchdown receptions in the past seven games . . . He leads the nation with nine games this season with 100 or more yards receiving . . . Snead also ranks fourth in the latest NCAA statistics in receiving yards per game (119.1) and eighth in receptions per game (8.1).

More Snead: Willie Snead ranks second in Ball State history in career receptions (214) and second in career receiving yards (2,904) -- despite being only a junior for the Cardinals . . . He is first on Ball State's all-time list for 100-yard receiving games in a career with 13 . . . Snead is only the second player in Ball State history to record two 1,000-yard receiving seasons, and became just the third player in Ball State history to reach 200 catches in a career . . . Dante Ridgeway is the only other player in school history with two 1,000-yard seasons . . . Snead managed 1,148 yards in 2012 and has 1,429 in 2013 . . . His yardage total this year is the Ball State single-season record, while his 97 catches ranks third all-time for the Cardinals.

Little Man Playing Big: Ball State senior **Jamill Smith**, who is listed at 5-8, 140 lbs., tallied three receiving touchdowns in the regular season finale vs. Miami University and now has 17 career TD catches to rank sixth on Ball State's all-time list . . . He now has eight receiving touchdowns and one rushing TD this season . . . Smith tallied the first rushing touchdown of his career on a reverse at Eastern Michigan . . . Smith has now scored TDs receiving, passing and rushing in his Ball State career, having thrown a TD pass to quarterback Keith Wenning at Indiana in 2012.

Little Man Playing Big Part II: Jamill Smith ranks first in the MAC and 20th in the nation in kickoff returns with a 26.5 average in 2013 . . . Smith ranks second in Ball State history with 1,988 career kickoff return yards . . . He had a career long 42-yard punt return vs. Central Michigan . . . Smith is third on Ball State's all-time list with 469 career punt return yards . . . He has three career 100-yard receiving games . . . He ranks fifth at Ball State in career receptions (173) and eighth in career receiving yards (1,978).

Don't Forget About JW: **Jordan Williams** has four 100-yard receiving games this season after leading the Cardinals with 161 receiving yards in the regular season finale vs. Miami University.

The Trio: **Jordan Williams** (161), **Willie Snead** (133) and **Jamill Smith** (127) became the first trio in Ball State history to have at least 100 yards receiving in a single game when they accomplished the feat in the season finale vs. Miami University . . . It was the 12th time in Ball State history with multiple receivers over 100 yards and the fourth time in 2013.

Leading the D: **Ben Ingle** leads the team with 105 tackles, while **Brian Jones** has 90 and **Zack Ryan** is third with 85 . . . Jones leads the Cardinals with four fumble recoveries and is one shy of tying the single-season school record . . . **Jonathan Newsome** leads the Cardinals with 11.5 tackles for loss and eight sacks . . . **Jeffery Garrett** has a team high five interceptions.

Kicking Game: **Scott Secor** has made 11 consecutive field goals, which ties for the second longest streak in Ball State history . . . He has made 16-of-17 field goals from 45 yards or less this season.

BALL STATE AND USC

Only once in the last decade has a team finished the season with players ranked in the top five nationally in passing yards, receiving yards and rushing touchdowns. That school was USC in 2005. Ball State currently has Willie Snead fourth in the nation in receiving yards, Keith Wenning fifth in the nation in passing yards and Jahwan Edwards 19th in the nation in rushing TDs.

BALL STATE AND ITS TWO 1,000-YARD RECEIVERS

For the first time in Ball State's 89 years of football, the Cardinals have two receivers with over 1,000 yards receiving in the same season. Willie Snead has 1,429 receiving yards, while Jordan Williams has 1,016 this season. Ball State is one of only two schools in the country to have two 1,000-yard receivers in 2013, with Fresno State being the other.

THE ONLY FBS TEAM IN THE NATION

Ball State is the only Football Bowl Subdivision team in the country to have a quarterback with at least 34 touchdown passes, a receiver with at least 14 TD receptions and a running back with at least 13 rushing touchdowns.

ONE OF ONLY THREE IN THE NATION

Ball State is one of only three Football Bowl Subdivision teams in the country to have student-athletes that were one of the 10 semifinalists for the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award and the Fred Biletnikoff Award. Ball State's Keith Wenning (Johnny Unitas) and Willie Snead (Biletnikoff) represented Ball State, while Clemson and Fresno State were each represented in the final 10 for each of the awards.

• **Scouting Arkansas State:** The Red Wolves are 7-5 overall and finished the season with a 5-2 record in the Sun Belt Conference . . . Arkansas State ended the season with a 34-31 loss at Western Kentucky, but had won its previous four games . . . Adam Kennedy completed 215-of-310 passes for 2,349 yards with 11 touchdowns and six interceptions on the season . . . J.D. McKissic was the team's top receiver with 73 catches for 590 yards and four touchdowns . . . Julian Jones tallied 51 receptions for 630 yards and four scores on the year . . . Michael Gordon led the team in rushing with 106 carries for 717 yards and 10 touchdowns, while Kennedy rushed 147 times for 514 yards and four TDs.
